SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAMS

Sherwood School is pleased to offer lunch options available through the *PEI School Food Program* as well as our own *HotLunches* program. A brief description of both can be found below.

PEI SCHOOL FOOD PROGRAM

The PEI School Food Program is a provincial lunch program that offers ALL Island students K-12 a healthy and affordable lunch 5 days per week! The PEI School Food Program is accessible through the Bon Appétit ordering platform. User registration is now open at www.peischoolfood.ca. We encourage you to check out the program and menu options online. Detailed information has been sent home with your child.

SHERWOOD HOT LUNCHES

Our school-based lunch program consists of white and chocolate milk daily and Stratford Pizza on Fridays.

Orders are placed in advance and follow a two-week order cycle.

All orders must be placed by 9 am on the Saturday prior to the 2-week order cycle. We encourage parents to pay by Bambora. This saves sending money to school with your child and makes it much quicker for the order to be processed. If you need to send a cheque, please make cheques payable to Sherwood School and send it in a baggie with your child's name, parent name and homeroom. If the payment is not received on time, your child's order will not be processed.

- Choose food items and become familiar with the service.

SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION

As work continues on the new Sherwood School, there may be instances when, for safety reasons, the work being done outside may impact when or where student activities take place. The school will communicate with parents and guardians through school messenger ahead of time should an instance like this arise.

"SHOW SHERWOOD" SHOWCASE AND JUGGLING SHOW

Grades 4,5, and 6 students have been invited to submit an act for our "Show Sherwood" Showcase 2024. The showcase will be presented to the school at the end of January and will include acts that demonstrate any music, art pieces, or physical movement skills. This event will "showcase" skills that Sherwood students have (i.e. martial arts demo, playing a song on a piano, a short gymnastics routine, prepared dance, basketball tricks, skipping tricks, etc.) and might not have a chance to show during a regular school day. Any interested Grade 4,5, and 6 students are asked to plan, prepare and practice (practice and practice) and submit either a short video of the act to our Showcase committee or show in-person during one of the set times (to be announced at school). There will be a few in-school opportunities to practice but it is highly encouraged for participating students to be practicing at home as well.

HEALTHY SNACK WEDNESDAY

The school will be providing students with the opportunity to have a free healthy snack each month on a Wednesday. Our next healthy snack will be trail mix and will be provided on Wednesday, January 31st . Leadership students will deliver this snack to classes and a healthy snack alternative will also be provided for gluten allergic students.

PEANUT/NUT RESTRICTED SCHOOL

Sherwood School is a peanut/nut restricted school. We have several students who have a life-threatening food allergy (anaphylaxis) to peanuts/nuts. Our school strives to keep these students safe in the school environment. It is necessary to check all ingredient labels to see if the products contain peanuts/nuts. Please do not send these products to school or on field trips at any time. In addition, we do not allow WOW butter in the school so please do not send this with your child. We appreciate the home and school for working together to provide a safe place for all our students. Thank you for your cooperation.

SCENT FREE SCHOOL/SCENTS IN WORKPLACES

Please note that Sherwood School has a fragrance/scent free rule that complies with the Public Schools Branch. Recently, there has been an increase in concerns related to scents in PSB learning and work places. For many people, when exposed to the ingredients in scented products, it can adversely affect thier health. People with allergies and asthma report that certain odors, even in small amounts, can cause asthma symptoms. STORM CLOSURES

School cancellations

All Public Schools Branch (PSB) weather-related cancellations will be announced on local radio stations and posted on the PSB website by 7:00 am. An announcement that "all classes in the public schools branch are cancelled" means that there is no school for students. An announcement of a "system-wide shutdown" indicates that all schools and offices are closed. In some instances, it may only be necessary to close an individual school or a Family of Schools. Partial system closures or delays will be announced by Family of Schools. Sherwood School is in the Charlottetown Family of Schools.

One-hour delay

If a decision on cancellation cannot be made by 7:00 am, a one-hour delay will be announced whereby all schools and buses will operate one hour later than usual. A further announcement will be broadcast by 8:00 am.

Late buses

In some instances, even in fine weather, buses may be delayed. Parents will be notified via radio broadcast that a bus will be delayed (i.e. Bus #297 is running 30 minutes late).

School closures during the day

It may be necessary to close school partway through a school day. Detailed announcements will be made on local radio stations and posted to the PSB website as early as possible.

Parents who will not be at home when children arrive are responsible for making alternate arrangements for the care of their children on such days. If you have not done so already, please notify the school of these arrangements as soon as possible.

Extreme weather during the school day

Should the department of transportation and/or the RCMP recommend that school buses remain off island roads, students may be required to remain at school beyond their normal dismissal time (unless picked up by a parent or designate). Announcements will be made on local radio stations and posted to our website

On days when classes are in session, and the low temperature combined with wind provides a wind chill of -20 or below, students will not be required to go outside at recess or lunch or remain outside upon morning arrival.

Suggestions for parents

The final decision to attend school or to travel to school via school bus always rests with the parent.

- Please do not drop children off at school unless you are certain that school is operating that day and that staff are present to supervise the children.
- Please listen to the radio and check the PSB website frequently between 6:30 and 8:00 am daily to determine if schools are operating. Every effort will be made to have announcements broadcast by 7:00 am.
- 3. Please do not call the school, PSB office, or radio stations for information on cancellations or delays. Such calls tie up telephone lines which may be needed for emergency use.
