# **School Dance**

The Home and School Association will be hosting a School Dance on February 23. The school dance is a free, fun event for students and siblings of Sherwood School. Students will be required to come with a guardian and that guardian must remain at the event throughout. Each guardian can be responsible for multiple children. This is not a staff run event. It is a Home and School volunteer-based event.

Families will sign up in advance. Everyone attending will need to sign up. Due to fire regulations, numbers will need to be managed accordingly. There will be two slots available to accommodate the potential for a large attendance. If two slots are not required, we will determine that the week beforehand and make all families aware of the change.

There will be a small selection of concessions and glow sticks for sale at this event. These will be inexpensive and will help offset any costs associated with the event itself. Entrance for the dance will be the Garden entrance, closest to Cody Banks arena.

The Home and School are requesting parent volunteers, approx. 10 per time slot. Parents will be able to sign up as volunteers closer to the event.

# **NEW SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION**

Below is a schedule for some significant construction work at the new school site that may impact the activities of students and staff for several days in the remainder of January. Large DOAS units (air and heating systems) are being delivered and lifted by crane to the second floor on January 29 and 30. The trailers carrying the units will be brought in through the school staff parking lot area and the area by the gym on the Cody Banks side. Staff parking will be restricted in the parking lot on the side closest to the school. The emergency exit by the gym on the Cody Banks side will be closed off from January 26 to February 2. There are currently no classes that use this door for fire drills and anyone who would need to exit from this door in an emergency would exit on the Pine Drive side. The area that students may not cross will be fenced off with temporary fencing and signage. Play spaces and locations during recess breaks may be impacted during this time including potentially moving to indoor recess activities. Homeroom teachers will review expectations with students regarding any changes in routine. Phys.ed classes will take place in homeroom classrooms during any times of the school day that lifts may take place. The plan for the week includes the following actions on these dates:

Jan 25/26 – DOAS units will be delivered to site and parked at the lower part of the existing Sherwood School parking lot. Temporary fencing will be erected for safety and security. The units will be offloaded using a crane onto the parking lot from a tractor trailer during times when students are not outside. Jan 29 – Remove patio deck and complete earth work. Remove construction fence and build a ramp into the construction site.

Jan 30 – Load 1<sup>st</sup> DOAS unit into new school. Jan 31 – Load 2<sup>nd</sup> DOAS unit into new school. Jan 31/Feb 1 – Construct support base and replace

Feb 1/2– Reinstate construction fence and remove temporary fence panels.

These dates are contingent upon availability of the crane operator and the wind and weather conditions for lift days.

# **HEALTHY SNACK WEDNESDAY**

The school will be providing students with the opportunity to have a free healthy snack each month on a Wednesday. Our next healthy snack will be Trail mix that will be provided on Wednesday, January 31<sup>st</sup> Leadership students will deliver this snack to classes and a healthy snack alternative will also be provided for gluten allergic students.

# **SHOW SHERWOOD SHOWCASE**

Grades 4,5, and 6 students have been invited to submit an act for our "Show Sherwood" Showcase 2024. The showcase will be presented to the school at the end of January and will include acts that demonstrate any music, art pieces, or physical movement skills. This event will "showcase" skills that Sherwood students have (i.e. martial arts demo, playing a song on a piano, a short gymnastics routine, prepared dance, basketball tricks, skipping tricks, etc.) and might not have a chance to show during a regular school day. Any interested Grade 4,5, and 6 students are asked to plan, prepare and practice (practice and practice) and submit either a short video of the act to our Showcase committee or show in-person during one of the set times (to be announced at school).

There will be a few in-school opportunities to practice but it is highly encouraged for participating students to be practicing at home as well.

# **SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAMS**

# PEI SCHOOL FOOD PROGRAM

# SHERWOOD HOT LUNCHES

Our school-based lunch program consists of white milk, chocolate milk daily and Stratford Pizza on Fridays. Orders are placed in advance and follow a two-week order cycle.

All orders must be placed by 9 am on the Saturday prior to the 2-week order cycle. We encourage parents to pay by Bambora. This saves sending money to school with your child and makes it much quicker for the order to be processed. If you need to send a cheque, please make cheques out to Sherwood School and send it in a baggie with your child's name, parent name and homeroom. If the payment is not received on time, your child's order will not be processed.

Sherwood School is a peanut/nut restricted school. We have several students who have a life-threatening food allergy (anaphylaxis) to peanuts/nuts. Our school strives to keep these students safe in the school environment. It is necessary to check all ingredient labels to see if the products contain peanuts/nuts. Please do not send these products to school or on field trips at any time. In addition, we do not allow WOW butter in the school so please do not send this with your child. We appreciate the home and school for working together to provide a safe place for all our students. Thank you for your cooperation.
